CODE OF CONDUCT

This Code of Conduct is a set of rules which go beyond the Scout Promise and Scout Law. The intention is to ensure that everyone gets the most out of the planned meetings and that all HAVE FUN.

Obey the Scout Law:

- A Scout is to be trusted
- A Scout is loyal
- A Scout is friendly and considerate
- A Scout is a member of the world-wide family of Scouts
- A Scout has courage in all difficulties
- A Scout makes good use of time and is careful of possessions and property
- A Scout has self respect and respect for others

Remember what we all promise:

On my honour, I promise that I will do my best,
to do my duty to God and to the Queen,
to help other people and to keep the Scout Law

Bullying:

- We have **zero tolerance** to any form of bullying

Be respectful:

- Have respect for other Scouts, Leaders and visitors
- Have respect for and look after other people's possessions
- Have respect for and look after the kit belonging to the Scout Group
- Don't be silly or irresponsible at meetings

- Wear the Scout uniform every week
- Always try our best
- No chewing gum or unauthorised eating

Noise:

- Get attention **without shouting**
- No inappropriate language, singing or other noises

Be attentive:

- Listen to Leaders
- Actively respond to instructions
- Let people finish talking without interruption
- Stay on task

Be responsible for ourselves:

- We are at Scouts to have fun
- Be open to trying new experiences
- Help at fundraising activities so we can enjoy the rewards
- We are part of the troop – so contribute ideas towards it

The leaders always have the right to send a Scout home during any meeting or camp, should the behaviour be significantly inappropriate or if there is an incident of bullying.

If any equipment is damaged or broken, a discussion between the Scout, parent and appropriate leaders will be arranged to discuss payment and or replacement of the equipment.

We also believe in the truth – We would always prefer a Scout to accept responsibility for any inappropriate behaviour and discuss it to come to an agreed resolution.
